## For those with a sweet tooth, discover the "chuc" tart (or sugar tart).

Those from the Nord region love recipes that are simple yet comforting, particularly when it comes to pastries. These include the unmissable sugar tart or "chuc" tart, as locals call it. This speciality, a cross between a tart and a cake, is very popular in the homes in the Nord region and Belgium, but it is tricky to find it in the shops.

If you want to try it, we recommend you learn how to make this unbeatable recipe!

The recipe has several basic ingredients: flour, butter, sugar and yeast. The sugar melts upon cooking, forming a caramelised crust that gives the tart all its flavour. But those with a sweet tooth won't miss out on adding some crème fraîche when it comes out of the oven!

## **EDUCATION SERVICES**

Are you planning to live and work in the Dunkirk area? The region is booming and is the ideal setting for your children's education, with a vast network of schools from nursery to university level.

For the youngest children, there are more than 40 nursery schools and kindergartens for the first steps in your children's education. Plus, from pre-school onwards, your children will have access to bilingual French-English teaching at schools such as the Giono, Meurisse and Charles Perrault pre-schools, as well as an introduction to Dutch at the Alain Savary school.





For secondary school students, there are 260 schools providing a quality education, with a baccalaureate (A-level equivalent) pass rate of almost 94%, slightly higher than the national average. There are also many post-baccalaureate (post-A-level) opportunities, thanks to courses offered by universities, grandes écoles and training centres, some of which are apprentice courses, in line with the needs of local businesses.

#### AQUATIC CENTER LINÉO - WORMHOUT

The latest addition to Dunkirk's water sports centres, Linéo is a modern and sustainable spot. Not only does it have a 25-metre sports pool, child's play area and a playground slide... plus a steam room, sauna and spa await the adults for a spot of idyllic relaxation.

#### LE CAMÉLUS -GHYVELDE

Spend some family time on this 7.5hectare educational farm, where young and old alike can marvel at the Watusi cattle, ostriches and fourhorned sheep. More than a hundred animals and nearly 40 species are waiting to be petted, fed and even cared for during the workshops occurring throughout the year.



#### LE PAARC -GRAVELINES

Nestled among 175 hectares of lush green land, the PAarc des Rives de l'Aa is a landmark for sports, leisure and nature enthusiasts. With its Olympic water sports stadium and numerous outdoor activities, it invites families and sports enthusiasts alike to come along for a wonderful time!



#### DUNES MARCHAND -ZUYDCOOTE

Hike along the North Sea coast to discover the unique flora and fauna of the Flemish dunes. Start your journey at La Ferme du Nord, built in 1910, and enjoy a little jaunt between the towns of Zuydcoote and Bray-Dunes through 83 hectares of nature, sculpted by the wind.

## **SUSTAINABLE REGION**

## Consuming locally and in bulk, small gestures go a long way!

In the Dunkirk urban area, a number of shops have opted to provide bulk products as alternative an to unnecessary packaging. These include the Épicerie Maison Jouve in Rosendaël, Biocoop in Coudekergue- Branche and La Tournée du Vrac in Dunkirk, as well as many others where local residents can buy food, household and cosmetic products in bulk.

But buying in bulk is not restricted to these specialist shops. More and more Dunkirk residents are bringing their own containers with them when they visit their local baker, cheesemonger or even the chip shop. This simple approach helps to reduce the use of single-use packaging while maintaining customers' shopping habits at their usual retailers.



By 2030, the major supermarkets will have to offer 20% of their products in bulk, so let's start doing the right thing now!

EFinally, for those wishing to buy direct from producers, the Dunkirk region gives you a range of options. In addition to the local markets held every week, the Greater Dunkirk Urban Council is developing initiatives to facilitate access to healthy, local food. Due to open in March 2025, the **Halle des Sœurs Blanches** will be a place where local producers and craftspeople can sell their products directly to local residents.

In addition, many farms, particularly in the Hauts de Flandre Greater District Council (CCHF), are opening their doors to consumers. These farms, such as <u>Chêne Vert à Hoymille</u>, not only allow you to buy fresh, seasonal produce directly from producers, but also support the local economy.
